Some Councillors thought that it would still require some tailoring to make it easier to use for other village groups, such as the village hall. Members of the Parish Council will also have new email addresses as the government is keen to encourage parish councils to adopt official [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk) email addresses as part of its wider drive to improve transparency and cyber security within local government. This helps users easily identify genuine council communications, and reduces the risk of fraud or impersonation. It also promotes consistency across the sector and demonstrates that parish councils are operating to recognised standards of governance and digital security.

Unfortunately, no-one has taken up Anne Lunt's role of coordinating the Party-in-the-Park this year. If anyone within the village would like to volunteer, then please contact a member of the parish council.

A Road Closure Notice was received for Cold Harbour Hill Lane. The road is expected to be closed from 17/06/2026 to 19/06/2026 to enable Wessex Water to repair a mains leak.
